For 53 years, Janus Youth Programs has created paths to success for children, youth and families in Oregon and Southwest Washington through programs that address child abuse, domestic violence, provide residential treatment for teenagers who have experienced abuse, end youth homelessness, create access to affordable housing and open the door to employment and higher education opportunities.

While the challenges facing the 4,000 youth and families we helped this year were significant, we were able to address the challenges because of your financial support. Highlights of the impact of your support include ...

- **50,000** critical hygiene and first-aid supplies were distributed to youth struggling to survive on the streets,
- **43,800** meals were provided at our two youth shelters (the only youth shelters in the community),
- **465** young parents with children received rental and housing assistance,
- **448** intake assessments were completed connecting homeless youth to community resources,
- **419** young parents and children participated in child development and early childhood screenings and abuse prevention programs,
- **\$14,000** in scholarship support was awarded making it possible for youth to enroll in technical training and/or community college programs.

Despite the local and national financial challenges we will face in the months ahead, Janus Youth Programs remains committed to building on our achievements this past year as we work to change lives and build futures in the coming year.

As you make your year-end giving plans, I hope you will continue to partner with us to create a vibrant community where every child, youth and family has a safe place to live, prosper and achieve the life they envision.
